The Assembly – full-day international conference taking place on 20 March, 2014 – will gather leaders of higher education institutions (HEIs), governmental officials, representatives of NGOs, as well as employers' associations and businesses. At the Assembly the findings from university – business cooperation (UBC) case studies will be presented and the pre-defined prerequisites for successful UBC will be approbated. The event will be structured around 3 major headlines: INNOVATIVE IDEAS (solutions), PEOPLE (human resources and labour market), ENVIRONMENT (cooperation platforms). Last but not least, the Assembly is envisioned to be an event for active discussion questioning *Why to cooperate?*, *What are prerequisites?*, *How does success look like?* and *What lessons are learned?*, as well as networking and inspiration from each other and from the key-note speakers who will be sharing and reflecting on their experiences and future visions.
